Through our "Join the Conversation" community-outreach program, hundreds of Moreno Valley residents have provided feedback, and they continue to rank public safety as their top priority.

Crime remains a great concern, as the State allows more and more prisoners to be released into Southern California communities. At the same time, the County of Riverside continues to increase the cost of the law enforcement and fire services we contract for.
